
Next Event

Officer Meeting Highlights

- Transition Tasks Exchange of information regarding status of upcoming events and continued projects and activities, review of officer duties, social media privilege adjustments, email forwarding changes, password updates, plans for ongoing communication, bank signature updates, etc.
- Wording adjustment/polishing for by-law changes announced in December and to be voted upon at the January member meeting.
- January meeting planning Confirm with Coasters, plan education topic, announce 2018 SAAZ Brewer of the year, raffle, special drawing for members with 2019 dues paid.
- Finalize "2018 SAAZ Brewer of the Year" and define conditions more clearly for future (wins from Florida Circuit competitions only since intra-club competitions already rewarded with a prize).
- Need to investigate "Lifetime Membership" mug options several members still owed these.
- Goals for 2019 Renew focus on brewing education and improvement, change up the intra-club competitions to encourage brewing some different styles, make 2019 CSAAZ event worthy of "25th Annual" (2018 was already excellent, but would like to expand club member participation in the event weekend and encourage attendance from more of the Florida homebrew clubs).
- Upcoming events/parties Continue to investigate new locations for Summer Party due to rental
 price doubling, match indoor air-conditioned meeting venues with hotter months and outdoor
 locations with cooler months, review suitability of previously used and new locations based upon
 privacy/noise/parking/etc., plan "Pack the Pub" social events for sponsor venues that aren't as
 suitable for meetings.
- Expansion of education efforts Design more interactive experiences, bring back group brew
 days, create database/spreadsheet of knowledge within the club and draw upon it, match new
 brewers who want to learn with a willing (and local, if possible) experienced brewer, plan
 stewarding and judging classes, look into collaboration with professional breweries/brewers.
- Commander SAAZ Start planning and begin creation of timeline, tasks, schedule, deadlines now, and continue to flesh out more detail as the year goes on. Use lessons learned from 2018, both what worked well and what can be improved. Create a Commander SAAZ planning committee that meets regularly, separate from officer meeting and general membership meeting. Break out the general event coordinator duties from the competition coordinator duties to improve efficiency.

National Homebrew Competition – Hosted by AHA. Registration Jan 22 (10AM MST) to 29 (3PM MST).

<u>21st Domras Cup Mead Competition</u> – Hosted by Savannah Brewers League (not local, but a very established competition). Entry registration open until January 19, but limited to 200 entries. They have 182 entries as of this newsletter mailing. (*Not a Florida Circuit competition*)

<u>2019 Coconut Cup</u> – Hosted by Miami Area Society of Homebrewers (MASH). Entry Window Jan 7–31. s = Up to 6 entries per Brewer, 400 entry total cap. Competition Dates Mar 1-2. (*Florida Circuit*)

While in the Tampa area for 20+ years Bob was an early member of PUBGuild and a founding a member of the Suncoast Barley Mashers Guild, serving as Education Chair and Membership Chair.

By-Laws Change Notice

As announced in the December newsletter, the following changes have been proposed for the SAAZ bylaws. All current paid members present at the January general members meeting can vote on these changes at the meeting.

Creating an officer position for Sponsorship and Swag referred to as SAAZ Ambassador/CSAAZ Competition Organizer. Duties include:

- Maintaining club sponsorship records and requests
- · Communicating with event and club sponsors

- Primary coordinator for the Commander SAAZ competition based upon BJCP guidelines

- Utilizing other communications tools as appropriate
